THE REJECTED JESUS APPEARS TO HIS DISCIPLES

He was real and physically present. He told them to share the good news of his death and resurrection with everyone in the world. And then, right in front of their eyes, he rose into the air up to heaven. They were alone again. There are two primary reasons Jesus chose them. First, **they served as eyewitnesses.** They were with Jesus. They witnessed His ministry and resurrection. Many Jews refused to acknowledge him as the Messiah, as **Jesus was preaching a doctrine contrary to their beliefs and expectations.** Christ "... to his bitter denunciation, "I don't know the man!"
